- Know your way around a bottling line, winery production and winemaking equipment?
- Speak the secret language of PLCs and VFDs?
- Can you juggle multiple project deadlines without breaking a sweat?

In this role, you'll thrive if you love working independently and being the person everyone can count on. You're quick on your feet, calm under pressure, and have the creativity to troubleshoot just about anything. We'll trust you to keep our beautiful wines flowing into bottles and into the hands of those who love them.

RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Performing all bottling line maintenance, which includes line changes, machine adjustments, monitoring of equipment condition, preventative maintenance, repairs, troubleshooting, and ordering, inventory and installation of replacement parts.
- Assisting bottling personnel during production, including supervision of temporary staff in the absence of supervisor.
- Performing repairs, modifications and preventative maintenance on all winery equipment and facilities, i.e., “the entire winery”, to completion. This may include basic carpentry, painting, electrical and plumbing repairs, welding and concrete work.
- Maintaining and repairing winery water delivery system, wastewater system, and storm water conveyance system.
- Diagnosing issues with equipment and facility systems and determining required repairs or modifications, including isolation of the malfunction, disassembly of equipment and repair or replacement of bearings, gears, structural components, etc.
- Performing skilled level repairs and modifications on buildings and grounds. Tasks include, plumbing, electrical, welding, painting and handy-man type tasks.
- Responds to emergency situations in order to resolve issues in a timely manner. (may be afterhours)
- Operating a forklift to move supplies and equipment, and driving company vehicles as required.
